Easterseals NH & VT will present Matthew Boucher with the Eugene Van Loan III Leadership Award. Named in honor of former Board Chairman Eugene Van Loan III, this biennial award is given to an individual who represents a longstanding commitment to our agency’s values. Matthew will formally receive this award at our [Annual Celebration Breakfast on Thursday, November 7](#).

Matthew has served on our Board since 2012 and was Chairman from 2018 to 2020. He was the final Board Chairman during Larry Gammon’s 47-year tenure as President & CEO, and also presided over the search committee that welcomed Maureen Beauregard in 2019.

With his financial background, Matthew led us through several periods of institutional crisis, including the height of the Covid-19 pandemic, when he oversaw weekly finance task force meetings. Matthew is also a proud advocate of our programs and mission. His son, Sebastian, continues to receive our services today.

Community-Based Services Home Undergoes Complete Renovation

We're excited to share the news that Spruce Keys, one of our more than 20 Community-Based Services homes across New Hampshire, has undergone a complete makeover!

The three-month project has created a modern, comfortable living space for nine women whom we serve in our Community-Based Services program, which helps adults with intellectual disabilities and acquired brain injuries achieve stability, well-being, and fulfillment through a variety of services. “These individuals receive the extra help they need, like transportation to work, from our dedicated staff of 27 on a 24-hour, seven-day-a-week basis,” says Renee Fisher, our Senior Vice President of Long Term Supports and Services. “With this new home, Easterseals NH no longer requires a rental property, which costs \$54,000 annually to rent.”

The Manchester, New Hampshire, residence features three, 3-bedroom units complete with modern kitchens and laundry rooms. From Student to Teacher

Javauna’s story at our West Side Early Childhood Center of Excellence in Manchester, New Hampshire, began long before she joined Easterseals NH & VT.

While studying Educational Behavioral Science at Concord Regional Technical Center in New Hampshire, Javauna realized her passion for child care and sought work in the field. She started at the very place that shaped her childhood. “I found that Easterseals NH was hiring for an Associate Teacher,” Javauna explained.

Javauna attended child care at the West Side location as a toddler and thought working there might be an excellent opportunity to explore working in early childhood education. She joined the team as a Child Care Assistant, and from the moment she arrived, she knew it was the right place for her.

“I loved the teachers and how they interacted with the kids,” she said. “I honestly love it. I just love seeing the kids grow. I look forward to coming to work every day.”

Did You Know There Are Lots of Ways You Can Support Easterseals NH?

There are many ways you can help us elevate all abilities. While cash is the most common, you may not be aware of the advantages of donating other assets. Consider these options:

- **Individual Retirement Accounts (IRAs) or Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCDs):** A qualified charitable distribution allows individuals who are 70 ½ years or older to move up to \$105,000 per

year from their individual retirement accounts directly to their favorite charity without it affecting their taxable income.

- **Gifts of stock:** The option to donate securities is good for people who purchased stock over a year ago and, therefore, may be subject to long-term capital gains.
- **Donor-advised funds (DAFs):** A donor-advised fund, which is like a charitable savings account, allows you to recommend how much and how often a donation is made.

Among those who participated was Jakobie, a youth who utilizes Easterseals VT's Post Permanency Services; serving families formed by adoption or guardianship to help meet the child's needs, increase family stability, and locate community resources. Jakobie's family has utilized Easterseals VT services for eight years, following his adoption by his great-grandmother, Brenda.

Jakobie's rappel sparked his interest in trying activities like zip-lining and bungee jumping. "I loved going over the edge, and I look forward to doing it again next year," shared Jakobie.
